

Goodwill provides a wide range of services such as supportive community housing services, vocational training and evaluation, respite services and contracted business services throughout northeast lowa!







TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

Goodwill Industries of Northeast Iowa, Inc., was awarded the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title I Adult, Dislocated Worker, Youth, and Young Adult Service Program Contracts through lowaWorks.

WIOA is landmark federal legislation designed to strengthen and improve our nation's public workforce system and help get Americans, including youth and those with significant barriers to employment, into high-quality jobs and careers in addition to assisting employers in hiring and retaining skilled workers.

Under the direction of Goodwill Industries of Northeast lowa, Inc., the lowaWorks WIOA staff works directly with business managers, supervisors, human resources offices, and company owners to determine their individual needs for prospective employees, then develop plans for individuals to acquire the skills and education needed to fill the position.
